
For a while, it appeared Fairfax County Supervisor Jeff C. McKay might coast to the top political job in Virginia's largest jurisdiction. The moderate Democrat had been groomed as a replacement for retiring longtime board chair Sharon Bulova (D-At Large). And there was no broadly appealing Republican contender in increasingly blue Fairfax County, a place where leadership changes often seem like handoffs. But the ascension of McKay (D-Lee) now seems less certain, amid a surge of progressive candidates that will generate the first Democratic primary for board chair in decades, as well as a host of competitive races for other board seats.

Fairfax County Supervisor Catherine M. Hudgins announced Tuesday that she will not seek reelection in November, adding to a political transformation underway in Virginia's largest jurisdiction, where five board seats will now come open at the end of this year. Hudgins, 74, made her announcement during a county board meeting, saying simply that she will step down at the end of what will be her 20th year as the Democratic supervisor representing the Hunter Mill district. While expected, Hudgins's announcement underscores the dramatic changes facing Fairfax County's 10-member Board of Supervisors. Board chairman Sharon Bulova (D) and Supervisors Linda Q. Smyth (D-Providence) and John C. Cook (R-Braddock) have also announced that they will step down. Supervisor Jeff C. McKay (D-Lee) is seeking to replace Bulova, leaving his district seat open.




Fairfax Supervisors Set to OK Speed Humps in McLean

The Board of Supervisors on Jan. 22 was expected to endorse the Fairfax County Department of Transportation's plans to install a series of eight speed humps on two streets in McLean. One speed hump would be placed near 1228, 1231 and 1232 Ingleside Ave. between Oak Ridge and Hickory Hill avenues. The other seven would be installed on Bellview Road between Old Dominion Drive and Towlston Road. The \$64,000 initiative would be conducted under the Residential Traffic Administration Program, which reviews requests for traffic-calming made by county supervisors on behalf of local homeowner associations.



Fairfax County, Va., to Accept New Low-Income Applicants for Rent-Subsidized Program

Low-income residents in Fairfax County, Va., have an opportunity to apply for a Housing Choice Voucher for the first time in more than a decade. The Fairfax County Redevelopment and Housing Authority (FCRHA) is opening its Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) wait list for one week, beginning Tuesday. The HCV Program (formerly "Section 8") provides rental assistance to low-income families, seniors and persons with disabilities. Eligible applicants receive vouchers that subsidize rent at private properties with participating landlords.

Prince William County Supervisors Say Transportation, Parks Bonds Urgently Needed

With no state funding this year for 10 road projects in Prince William County, voters will be asked to approve new local funding sources to support road and park improvements, Supervisors Chairman Corey Stewart said Tuesday. "This community is growing too fast," he said. "We must pass this road bond, because we have to." The



Commonwealth Transportation Board staff has recommended no funding for Prince William County projects through its Smart Scale program, putting new stress on the county to find a different way to keep up with growth.

[Prince William County School Board Approves New Boundaries Impacting More Than A Dozen Elementary Schools](#)

The Prince William County School Board voted 7-1 to approve new elementary school boundaries at a meeting Wednesday where the board heard from about 60 parents and community members. The new boundaries will affect eastern and central Prince William County starting next school year, impacting thousands of students. School division staff developed a preliminary plan and a



volunteer group of community members from the Woodbridge, Neabsco and Occoquan districts helped develop further plans last fall, followed by two community meetings for parents to provide more input. At a meeting that began at 7 p.m., school board members continued discussing the proposed boundaries, debating whether it was better to create boundaries that eliminate 61 trailers or to take into account public input centered around concerns such as keeping communities together, not increasing driving time on busy Old Bridge Road, accommodating walkers and more.

[Planning Commission Backs Monopole Tower in Hume](#)

Awarding a special exception to erect a 145-foot monopole tower and equipment to provide broadband and cellular service in Hume won the backing of the Fauquier County Planning Commission last week. Two residents spoke in favor of allowing a tower of that height during a public hearing on Jan. 17 prior to the commission voting unanimously to recommend approval. The matter now goes to the board of supervisors for a public hearing and vote. "We're all for it," said Irvin Woods of Leeds Manor Road in Hume. Dale Cirillo, a teacher at Marshall Middle School, cited the benefits schoolchildren will gain from better broadband service. Bob Lee, Marshall District



representative on the planning commission, said the tower's height will provide space for multiple service providers "in an area known to be deficient in cell coverage and broadband."






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
